# **Attendance**

At Workington Academy we firmly believe that good attendance is key to students reaching their academic and personal potential. Students who miss school frequently can fall behind with their work, make reduced progress and typically do less well in exams.

High attendance shows potential employers that a young person is reliable and responsible. Furthermore, research suggests that children who attend school regularly could also be at less risk of getting involved in antisocial behaviour or crime.

The school measures attendance by the percentage of half day sessions which students attend. This places students into one of the following categories:

# **Course Description**

Students are introduced to the work of other artists and cultures to gain first-hand appreciation of their knowledge and skills which they can develop into areas such as Drawing and Painting, 3D Sculpture, Graphics, Fashion, Textiles, Photography or Digital Art. The course is assessment by exams (worth 40%) and Controlled Assessments (worth 60%).

#### Trial Exam Result

100% of the exam content and 50% of the Controlled Assessments have been assessed in the correct ratio to make up the trial exam grade.

#### Comments about Student

Student is a lovely student who tries hard in lessons. Last year she had additional time in Art and this removed much homework pressure. This year, however, she has not been so lucky and the lack of time she spends on her work is beginning to affect her grade. Student has decided to focus her work on 'hair' as a topic and often finds making a decision difficult. She is talented and can create some beautiful work but the lack of planning and preparation is showing.

### **Targets for Student**

Use the support at lunchtime and after school to improve quality of finish.

Take time in lesson to complete all tasks through listening to instructions carefully.

## **Course Description**

English Language: All pupils complete 4 Controlled Assessments; these are worth 40% of the final GCSE. 'Aspects of Non-Fiction' are studied for the examination, which is worth 60% of the final GCSE.

English Literature: All pupils complete one comparative Controlled Assessment, worth 25% of the final GCSE. The remaining 75% of the GCSE is divided between two examinations;' Exploring Modern Texts' and 'Poetry Across Time'.

#### Trial Exam Result

100% of the exam content and 100% of the Controlled Assessments have been assessed in the correct ratio to make up the trial exam grade.

#### Comments about Student

Student usually works well in English but she is prone to being easily distracted. I have combated this through the introduction of a new seating plan, where Student can hopefully focus on only the work! Her written work is of a fine standard, and she generally performs better in this area. Her recent exam result was disappointing, but it did emphasise what Student needs to focus on in order to improve.

Students study nine topics over the two year GCSE course. They submit two Speaking and two Writing controlled assessments and sit final exams in Listening and Reading at either Foundation or Higher level. The course is assessed by exams (worth 40%), and Controlled Assessments (worth 60%).

100% of the exam content and 100% of the Controlled Assessments have been assessed in the correct ratio to make up the trial exam grade.

#### Comments about Student

Student has a good attitude towards this subject and always tries his best. He has performed well in both writing controlled assessments and I was pleased with his overall performance in his recent listening and reading exams. Student narrowly missed a C grade in his trial exam. He knows that a decent performance in January's speaking test is essential if he is to achieve a C grade in French.
